MUSIC LESSONS

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Yesterday, we welcomed Mrs Fullerton, our specialist Music Teacher for 2024. Each week all classes will participate in a music lesson developing practical knowledge (exploring how sound is made, as they listen and respond to the elements of music: beat, rhythm, pitch, tempo, dynamics, and tone), developing ideas (exploring how to express and represent sounds and musical ideas), and communicating and interpreting (sharing music making with others and responding to music). We look forward to an amazing year of Music ahead with the guidance of Mrs Fullerton.



BIG BROTHER / BIG SISTER PROGRAMME (TUAKANA TEINA)

Our Big Brother and Big Sister Programme at St Therese School develops strong, connected relationships between our Year 8 leaders and our youngest students in Room 1. It is based on the traditional Maori concept called Tuakana Teina which embodies the idea of reciprocal learning and support within a community.

In the context of a school environment, Tuakana Teina refers to the practice of older or more experienced students (tuakana) providing guidance, mentorship, and support to younger or less experienced students (teina), while the younger students in turn offer respect, assistance, and a willingness to learn.

This concept fosters a sense of interconnectedness and collaboration among students of different ages, promoting a supportive and inclusive school culture. Older students act as role models and mentors, helping their younger peers navigate academic, social, and emotional challenges. They may offer assistance with schoolwork, share their experiences, and provide encouragement and advice.

Conversely, younger students contribute by showing respect for their older peers, being receptive to their guidance, and actively engaging in the learning process. Through this reciprocal relationship, both tuakana and teina benefit: older students develop leadership skills, empathy, and a sense of responsibility, while younger students receive personalized support, gain confidence, and feel a sense of belonging within the school community.
