You may have heard that members of the NZEI Te Riu Roa Union — which includes most of our staff — have voted to take strike action on Thursday 23 October 2025. This was not an easy decision, but one that reflects the deep commitment our staff have to ensuring the very best for our tamariki.

Why are staff striking?

Our teachers and support staff are standing together because they believe our students deserve better. They are asking the Government for:

- More support for learners a teacher aide in every classroom.
- Fair value for all school staff recognising the vital work they do each day.
- Keeping great teachers and staff in schools so our children receive the best education possible.

Because a large number of our staff are members of NZEI, St Therese School will be closed on Thursday 23 October. We will not have enough staff on site to open safely for students.

We know that this may cause some inconvenience for families and we truly appreciate your understanding and support.

LIFE EDUCATION MOBILE CLASSROOM VISIT



Last week, our students had the wonderful opportunity to step inside the Life Education Mobile Classroom with Teacher Daniel and special guest Harold the Giraffe!

Each class took part in fun and engaging sessions tailored to their age level. Students explored topics such as:

- Building positive relationships with others
- How to resolve conflicts and make good choices
- Understanding how to self-regulate emotions
- Discovering the different parts of the brain and what they do

Some classes even sketched the structure of the brain and discussed how it develops over time — linking science and wellbeing in a way that really captured their curiosity.

It's always an exciting experience stepping into the Life Education classroom. These lessons form part of this term's Health focus, and they've been a fantastic way to launch our learning around wellbeing, emotional awareness, and relationships.
